

Thank you to Darwin Lehmann and the Forest City School District for donating the back packs to us and also to the Food Bank of Iowa in Des Moines for allowing us to order food for this program along with what we order for our Wednesday night meal program.

Inclement Weather Policy

With winter weather in North Iowa, a plan needs to be in place to keep everyone safe when bad weather hits. Because of the importance we place on gathering for worship, fellowship, and education, we will make every effort to conduct Sunday and Wednesday activities. But just in case, please review our policy:

In the event of severe weather and we need to cancel in person worship, programs, and activities, we will strive to make this decision by 7:00 a.m. on Sundays and 2:00 p.m. on Wednesdays. When possible, a simplified live stream service will be available.

Weekday and evening programming activities will be cancelled if the public schools close or release early. Worship will be held otherwise noted. Funerals, weddings, and other special events will be conducted as scheduled if possible.

Cancellations will be communicated via KIOW 107.3FM radio (and on their webpage, kiow.com), KIMT television Channel 3 (and on their webpage, kimt.com), through Remind App, and on the Immanuel Lutheran Church Facebook page and website.

If severe weather strikes on other weekdays, the church office will remain open whenever possible.

No Time at all



It's December and January. For some people December flies by so fast. For some people January drags on. And for others it's the opposite, or maybe even the same for both months. For me December moves fast, the candles are lit, the family shows up, and by the time I say Merry Christmas it's New Years and the family is gone. January can be quiet, but I get out more when it snows, so it also goes pretty fast. And the saying is

true, that took no time at all!

No Time, the theme for Christmas Eve. Followed by The End Time is the Beginning, for New Years Eve. When Christ comes into the World, time almost stands still. It's almost as if time has no idea what to do next, because nothing like this has ever happened before. Time stands still for the Shepherds as they are visited by the Angels proclaiming the time is now, there's no time left for something old. Even as she was born there were numbers being shouted out, time that was passing, calling out each minute as they tested her to see where she was at. And everything went so well, yet fast, that the doctor eventually asked, do you want to hold her? And of course, Mindy said YES! We never thought we'd get to hold her right away, but here we were. And for a few moments, time stopped, there was no time at all.

This moment, when God indeed was now among us as a human, was time stopping, there was no time at all. God was now with us as never before. The Shepherds run to see Jesus, they don't think about time the same way. Instead, they know that time will never be the same again.

This was now a new time; the end of time became a new beginning. Immanuel, GOD WITH US! And things would change, eventually Jesus would grow, would share the Kingdom of Heaven for all, would suffer and die, and rise again! This new time is different, it was a new year with God. And when Zoey was born, time moved forward once again, but each moment was new, and something never experienced the same way again.

That's what this season is all about. Immanuel, God is with us. Jesus is born and in no time at all, there is a new time starting. Thank you, Jesus, for coming into our lives and making all things new.

In the cycle of our Church calendar, we have entered the sacred season of

Advent—a time of waiting, of expecting, and of preparing for the arrival of the Messiah. Advent speaks to the way God uses time and events in our lives to speak to us, mold us, challenge us, and bring us into holy completions and fresh starts

At times, the Christmas season seems rushed, filled with excessive activity, constant commotion, and our society's incessant compulsion for consumerism. It seems as if we're caught up in a maelstrom, overwhelmed by tasks, social gatherings, gift-buying, and end-of-year deadlines. In our haste, the solemn stillness of Advent might seem lost to us. And yet, even amid such flurry and frenzy, we are gently reminded of the urgency of the Day of the Lord. That advent, that glorious arrival, commands our focus and determination. Advent stands against our culture's 'fast-food mentality', beckoning us instead to be purposeful, to prepare and to wait.

As we look at our watches, synchronize our calendars, and note the hours ticking by, God is engaging with time in a remarkably different manner. For our eternal Creator, a day is as a thousand years and a thousand years as a day (2 Peter 3:8). God exists outside of time, and yet graciously enters into our timelines, impacting and transforming our experience of time itself.

God meets us where we are in our moments of hectic haste or oppressive tiredness. In our anxious ticking-off of minutes and days, God offers us moments of stillness, fragments of grace, and gifts us moments where we can encounter God afresh and come to understand ourselves better.

Time spent with God—whether in worship, service, prayer, or solitude—has a way of taking the raw, wild fragments of our days and transforming them into something meaningful. Something that looks remarkably like eternity. So let us consider, in this Advent season, how our perception of time might alter if we look to see how God meets us within it, how God blesses, shapes, and challenges us within our unique and shared experiences of time. Our moments of waiting could then become hallowed, drawing us closer to the One who promises us that all our holy endings will pave the way for our sanctified beginnings.

God's promise in Christ is that time—our lives—is not cyclical, always repeating, but linear, with an end, a goal, a completion. Christ's second Advent reminds us that history, indeed our lives, are not caught in a relentless cycle of creation and destruction. Rather, we are moving toward a redeemed creation, where there will be no more suffering or death, but the fullness of life with God.

So this Advent, I challenge you not only to observe the season but to step into its rich rhythm of hope, waiting, and expectation. Breathe deeply, live intentionally, wait patiently, serve lovingly, and experience fully God's presence in the midst of it all.

A student who is eating breakfast and lunch at school is charged about \$5 per day (these are students who are not receiving a free/ reduced lunch discount). A \$5 donation pays for one child's breakfast and lunch for one day; a \$25 donation pays for a week. Thank you for your consideration and donation to the kids! There is also a treasure box decorated by the Sunday School students in the Narthex to always add a donation to.

Noisy offerings will be taken during worship on Wednesday, Dec. 13 and Sunday, Dec. 17 to help with this mission. Thank you for caring!

Board notes

Mission & Outreach

The Mission & Outreach Board met via Zoom on Wednesday, November 8, at 4:45 p.m. Six members were present. Opening devotions were given by Jaci Thorson.

\$196.86 is needed to fulfill our 2023 covenant commitment to Missionary Karen Anderson.

Noisy offerings for the November mission emphasis, Good Samaritan Fund, were held on Wednesday, November 15, and on Sunday, November 19.

Forest City school lunch account assistance was chosen as the mission emphasis for the month of December. Noisy offerings will be held on Wednesday, December 13, and Sunday, December 17.

The Board's recommendation for equally dividing the net proceeds from the Thanksgiving meal between Missionary Karen Anderson and Wednesday Night Meals was shared with Council members.

The Board will be doing a holiday mission outreach project in December. Additional donations have been received for the Waldorf students. Donations of food for students to use during the winter break would also be welcomed. Additional information is shared in the December/January Messenger.

Trustees

The Board of Trustees met on November 6, 2023 at the church. October income was \$84,387.20 and expenses were \$83.109.61 with a positive \$1,277.59 for the month of October. YTD is a negative (\$26,431.68) compared to a negative (\$37,658.96) for 2022. Other income included \$32,374.81 from endowment principle for approved cost and expensed for the new boilers for facility upgrade, Four Oaks rent for \$1,344.75 and Salary Reimbursement of \$3,149.00 including Bethany. November and December mission to Western Iowa Synod \$2,833.33 will be paid out of endowment for mission.

Endowment: \$55,000 estimated for distribution in 2024.

Property Committee: Front porch cement is sagging on parsonage. Midwest Foundation repair will raise the front porch cement with foam injection Nov 8 for \$3,619. There is no budget for repairs. Cost will come from firm foundation.

Personnel Committee: To meet in November.

New Business: 2024 Budget was presented and approved and forwarded to council for approval.

Old Business: a.)4 Oaks update: Backpacks from a grant with food for students have been sent home for the students. There are currently 9 students.

by President Kathy McEnelly and October minutes were approved. Board reports, pastors' reports, and the Intern report were presented and approved.

Ben Arentson volunteered to serve as secretary for the council. Steve Westerberg volunteered to serve as vice president for the council.

Pastor Rod reported on the outcome of the Dessert forums. Approximately 50 people were in attendance. He felt that overall, it was a positive conversation.

Board of Trustees presented the 2024 Budget for approval. Business Financials can be found elsewhere in the Messenger. Next Council Meeting is December 11.

The Board of Parish Life met on Tuesday, November 7, 2023. Members present: Lisa Chisholm, Linda Ferjak, Tina Berg, Melanie Westerberg, Kathy Leuwerke, Pastor Zech, and Karen Keller.

The main order of business was discussing the Christmas bags for kids at the two afternoon Christmas Eve services. We will be putting an apple, candy cane, candies, a bookmark, and stickers in the bags. Pastor Zech will provide a message or an activity for the kids. Everyone volunteered to get the different items and we will assemble the bags at our next Board of Parish Life. We will be postponing the Board meeting until December 21st.

The Board of Parish life is responsible for the Music and Worship Budget. This includes Music and Worship Maintenance, Literature and Instruments, Licensing Fees, and Personnel. Kathy Leuwerke has recommended that these items stay in the Board of Parish Life Budget, but that they be prepared by the Director of Music, approved by the Council, and submitted to the Board of Parish Life which will present it in the budget recommendations.

The other recommendation Kathy had was concerning the financial statement. Each month Kim prepares a financial statement for the Council. Kathy would like to get a copy of the section of the Monthly Income Statement that contains all the line items in our budget so that we can compare actual amounts to budgeted amounts on a monthly basis rather than annually. She feels that it would give us a better idea of where we stand throughout the year in our area of responsibility. Both of these suggestions will be discussed at our next Board meeting which will be on December 21, 2023.
