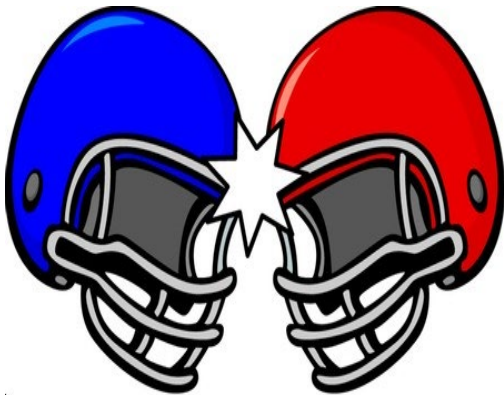

Many of you are members of Thrivent. You get statements from Thrivent and you have an ID card with Thrivent ID number. You have access to dollars for your church! You can apply for Action Grants (2 per calendar year) and get up to \$250 for any number of projects. To name some: Wednesday night meals, Quilters Group, Promiseland, Prayer Shawl Ministry, Choir, Bell Choir, Mission Projects, Lutheran World Relief Kits, etc. You are asked to identify a "project" and a specific date and tell Thrivent how you will use the award. If approved (and most are) you get a Visa card in the mail for the amount requested and this can be up to \$250.

I have a goal to have at least one \$250 Thrivent card grant for each month of 2024 to support a Wednesday night meal. So far, I have people lined up through April. This money makes a significant difference for our Wednesday night meals! Ideally, Thrivent wants the requestor to take part in the "project" but it doesn't have to be a huge part at all. After the project date, you go back online and report on the project and then you'll be eligible to apply for another one (up to 2 per calendar year).

Jaci Thorson or myself are happy to help you if you need assistance. Please consider accessing these funds for Immanuel for something we do that is meaningful to you and you'd like to support.

Wandering Heart



Do you ever get a card on Valentines Day? They all are lovely and talk about all sorts of love. The classic card writes, "Roses are Red, Violets are Blue, Sugar is Sweet, and So are You!" I'm pretty sure that's a card we all learned about early on. This year is one of those rare years when on Valentines Day the Card reads, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return". Not exactly the kind of card you expect, but this year Lent begins on February 14th. And we are reminded again of the greatest love there ever has been, the Love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.



The theme for Lent this year is Wandering Heart. Do you ever just wander around? I have from time to time, and really, it's sort of a journey. It's a journey where you may or may not know the destination, but the journey could go a lot of different ways. You may wander off the road and stop at an obscure tourist sight. Or maybe you want to go down a road not suggested by the GPS. Sometimes when we wander, we find our way back, and other times, we need help to get back on the right path. Our hearts in faith sometimes do the same thing, and we need Jesus to call us back to the right path repeatedly.

In the Gospels there is someone that does embody this idea of wandering, and being called back over and over, and he keeps on trying to get it right. His name is Peter. You know exactly who I'm talking about. And in this series, we follow Peter as he wanders. He wanders on the right path, and he strays from the path. He is called to drop his nets and follow, he walks and sinks on the stormy sea, he affirms Jesus is the Messiah, he is called the rock and shortly after Satan, he says he'll never deny and shortly after does it three times, and he runs to the empty tomb. Through it all we see Jesus loves us, even when we are imperfect and make mistakes, and wander. We will watch his journey of faith and see how it connects to our own journey. And as the description of the series says, "we're not idolizing or vilifying him. Instead, we're hoping to wander alongside him, open to what we might learn about Jesus and ourselves." It's a journey with Peter as we wander here, there, and everywhere. And yet, through it all, Jesus is right there with us, as he was right there with Peter each step of the way.

This Lent season I invite you to wander with us, wander with Peter, wander with Jesus. As the song forty days says, "forty days to wander, forty days to die to self, forty days to grow stronger." Lent has a reputation, but it's not such a bleak season. In fact, it's a season of hope, promise, and love. I look forward to wandering with you this season, and giving our hearts to Jesus, and growing stronger in him each and every day. Blessings on your Lenten Journey.

In July of 2012, my older son Eric got to attend the National Youth Gathering, which was in New Orleans that year, as it is again this year. He came home with so many stories from that week away. He spoke of the amazing experience of worshiping and celebrating Communion with 30,000 people. He told us about their day of service where they went into the community, which was still recovering from the devastation of hurricane Katrina, and they worked side-by-side with the people in the community to aid in those recovery efforts. He talked about the many inspirational speakers they heard from, one of whom was Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber, and that is where this stage of my journey began.

I watched the recording of Pastor Nadia speaking at the Gathering and I was intrigued. I looked her up online and started reading her books and I was quite surprised. She was definitely not what I had always pictured a pastor to look like or talk like or even be like, and this was a lightbulb moment for me. I began to realize that God can, and does, call people to be pastors, who don't necessarily look, talk, or act like "traditional" pastors. I began to realize that maybe God really was calling me to be a pastor too, though it was still five years before I finally said "yes" to that calling.

I started seminary in the fall of 2017, and it has been a wandering journey since then. I travel to campus the first week of each semester, except during the pandemic, to spend time in community with my classmates and be introduced to each course and instructor. I have attended classes full time and part time, all from the comfort of my own home (or office) thanks to the wonders of Zoom. I have taken trips on J-Term including an amazing immersive trip to Germany in 2019 to walk in the footsteps of Martin and Katie Luther, Phillip Melancthon, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, and many others. I spent a year as part of this family of faith, learning from, growing alongside, and serving as your pastoral intern.

And now my wanderings have brought me to this time and place. I have just finished my third and final J-Term, remotely through LSTC, where we delved into the Ministry of Administration, and I have begun my final two classes I need to graduate in May, an advanced Hebrew Bible course on the prophets through Trinity Lutheran Seminary and a final year leadership course through Wartburg Theological Seminary.

So, if I seem a little frazzled over the next few months, now you know why. As I wander towards the end of this part of the journey, and prepare to begin the next stage, I give thanks to God for each of you, as you have supported and guided me this far, and continue to do so in the coming months. Your prayers and affirmation are felt and heard and appreciated. May God bless our wandering hearts during this coming season and through all the seasons to come.

Mission & Outreach

The Mission & Outreach Board met via Zoom on Wednesday, Jan. 10, at 4:45pm. Four members were present.

The Thanksgiving meal raised \$1,779.26 after expenses, split evenly between Wednesday Night Meals and Missionary Karen each receiving \$889.63.

We have a carryover of \$722.75 towards our 2024 covenant commitment of \$5,000 to Mission Karen Anderson.

\$1,930.01 was received for the December mission emphasis for the Forest City school lunch account assistance.

We will have boxes set up for The Souper Bowl canned food/soup donations beginning Wednesday, Jan. 31 through Sunday, Feb. 11—the day of the Super Bowl.

Missionary Karen Anderson will be the recipient of the Lenten offerings.

A recommendation will be taken to the Council for the April Mission Emphasis to be the Western Iowa Synod challenge to raise \$350 to help pay for registration and other fees for the ELCA National Youth Gathering this July.

The Board of Trustees met on January 8, 2024 at the church and zoom. December income was \$93,904.49 and expenses were \$62,766.53 including paying back \$10,000 to contingency with a positive \$31,137.96 for the month of December. YTD is a positive \$15,244.88 compared to a negative (\$11,732.56) for 2022).

Other income included Four Oaks rent for \$1,344.75 and Salary Reimbursement of \$3,149.00 including Bethany. December mission to Western Iowa Synod \$2,833.33 was paid out of endowment for mission support.

Endowment: \$54,000 estimated for distribution in 2024.

Property Committee: Mike Oleson has submitted his retirement notice as of March 31, 2024. Board of Trustees congratulated and thanked Mike for his 15 years as property manager at Immanuel. Looking at grants to replace and purchase the kitchen ovens.

Personnel Committee: Steve Westerberg V. P. of council will chair personnel.

New Business:a) January 14 Board of Trustees is hosting Brunch after church.

b.) Angie, Kim, and Kathy to look at bylaws in Stove purchase.

Old Business:

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy McEnelly at 6:30 PM. Devotions were shared by Linda Ferjak.

Old Business

December minutes were approved following a motion by Steve Westerberg and seconded by Jen Jenkins. Motion unanimously carried.

Two motions were made by M&O Board and seconded by Linda and Jen, respectively, to approve the M&O board's recommendation for quarter 1's mission emphasis of Forest City Food Bank and the Lenten offerings to Missionary Karen. Kathy let the group know Mike Oleson turned in his resignation of Church Maintenance, effective March 31, 2024. Steve Westerberg made a motion to accept the consent agenda board reports, which was seconded by Matt Welp. Motion carried.

New Business

National Youth Gathering: The Synod also asked for consideration of sending \$350 dollars to the Western Iowa Synod to help cover the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans for underprivileged Western Iowa Youth.

Food Grant Update: The food grant support positions are slowly being populated. Two lead positions are left to fill are Volunteer Coordinator and Hospitality and Resource Team. Angie Thompson is working on several local and national grants to help with Wednesday night meals/kitchen needs.

Review and update council Activity Log: Council reviewed the 2023-2024 activity log and updated new members on the goals/priorities of the council.

Business Financials

December month to date income was \$93,904.49, month to date expenses totaled \$52,766.53. We were able to repay the \$10,000 borrowed from the contingency fund so total expenses were \$62,766.53. Income minus expenses and repayment was \$31,137.96. Year to date income was at 105.01% and expenses were 102.52% of budget.

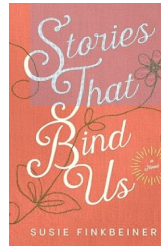
Promiseland News
